Pearl Harbor National Memorial to Honor U.S. Army Birthday

Honolulu, HI – Pearl Harbor National Memorial will honor the continued service and commitment inspired by the “Greatest Generation” by offering a special boat program for service members of each respective military branch throughout the year.

On Saturday, June 17 and Sunday June 18, U.S. Army military members (active duty, reserves, retirees, and veterans) and their dependents are welcome to assemble at the Bell Court at 3:30 p.m. for a special 4 p.m. USS *Arizona* Memorial boat program.

This program is time and capacity dependent and will be capped at 145 visitors total.
